Hints to Exhibitors:

- Where a Class calls for a certain number of blooms, remove all unnecessary buds before staging.
- Most blooms show off to advantage if sufficient length of stem is cut to enable the bloom to project well above the receptacle it is placed in.
- Cut flowers to be displayed in plastic vases, vases will be available on the day for exhibitors to place blooms ready for display.

Floral Hints

Pick most show entries on judging morning - very early (or late on the evening before) and put straight into water up to their necks - then taken inside for sorting into individual jars. Don't add anything to the water - if the flowers have a good drink when they are picked most will last without additives. The stage of bloom at cutting time is critical. The flowers should be fully out at judging but JUST! Judges look for different things with flowers and it is not always the size. Symmetry is very important - an even shape (the same on both sides) and blemish-free blooms.

Floral Art

Floral art sections are in titles - they are an art form, the title suggests a style and the finished article is a whole picture, a blend of shape, size, colour of container and contents. The first element is the container and it must suit the style. 'Bold and Beautiful' for example would not suggest a shapely, slender container. The next important element is the line material, or non-plant material that provides the background, the emphasis being on 'line'.







Rich Fruit Cake Recipe

Ingredients:

250 g (8 oz) sultanas

250 g (8 oz) chopped raisins

250 g (8 oz) currants

125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel

90 g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries 90 g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250 g (8 oz) plain flour

60 g (2 oz) self-raising flour 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves 250 g (8 oz) butter

250 g (8 oz) soft brown sugar

1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs

Instructions:

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts
- Sprinkle with the sherry or brandy
- Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight
- Sift together the flours and spices
- Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition
- Alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures
- Mix thoroughly; the mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20 cm (8")
- Bake in a slow oven for approximately 31/2 4 hours
- Allow the cake to cool in the tin

Note: - To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 - 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 - 4 pieces

State Competition ASC Group 7 Regional Finals 7th December 2024

Class: -Three different types of wool articles and/or garments

Conditions:

- 1 For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - a) Garment: an item that can be worn eg dress, jacket, scarf, hat
 - b) Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used
 - (i) in the home eg blanket;
 - (ii) with an outfit eg bag;
 - (iii) for amusement eg toy; and (iv) as a decoration eg picture etc.
- The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of 80% wool.
- 3 Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
- A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available as with hand spun/felted a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- 6 All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months
- 7 prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article /garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 9 An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Show Secretary (or delegate) may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitors permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- 12 It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to Sydney for the State judging.






