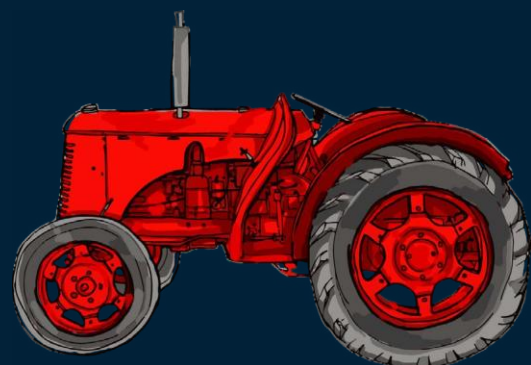
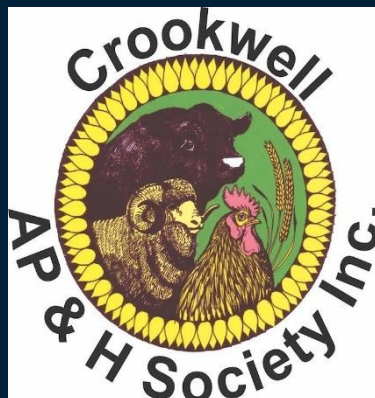

## General Exhibition Rules

Awards will be made public as judged.

The decision of the Committee shall be final in all cases.

All exhibits, except where specified, must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor. Exhibitors must make a Statutory Declaration as to ownership, age or breeding etc, if required by the Committee, or forfeit the prize won.

No entry will be required for any Champion or Aggregate Prize, nor will a fee be charged for such, unless specified.

Crossbred sheep will be defined as a cross between two breeds.

The Judge may order a Certificate of Merit to any exhibit considered worthy.

An exhibitor bringing diseased, dangerous, or noxious exhibits must remove same if requested to do so by the Stewards.

Any exhibitors wishing to dispose of their exhibits may attach to each exhibit the price wanted, on condition of payment to the Society of five (5) percent commission in case of sale.

All exhibits in the Pavilion must not be removed until the Sunday of the Show. The Pavilion will be cleared of all persons on the Sunday of the Show at 3:45 PM. At 4:00 PM the Pavilion will be re-opened for the removal of exhibits, when the exhibitors or their agents shall be in attendance to take delivery of their respective exhibits. Any exhibits not collected will be deemed as donated to the Crookwell AP&H Society.

All protests must be lodged with the Secretary within 24 hours of the notification of the Judge's award. Each protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$15.00 which will be forfeited should the protest be deemed by a majority of the Committee to be frivolous.

The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibitor or exhibit. And it shall be a condition of the entry that such exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from such accident, and the Society will not, under any circumstances, be responsible for any loss or miss-delivery of livestock or other exhibits of any kind, or any injury done thereto.

No distinctive marks allowed on exhibits in the Pavilion.

When the last bell rings, the top two teams will face off in an epic final showdown to see who will claim the glory and be crowned the very first Junior Relay Champions!

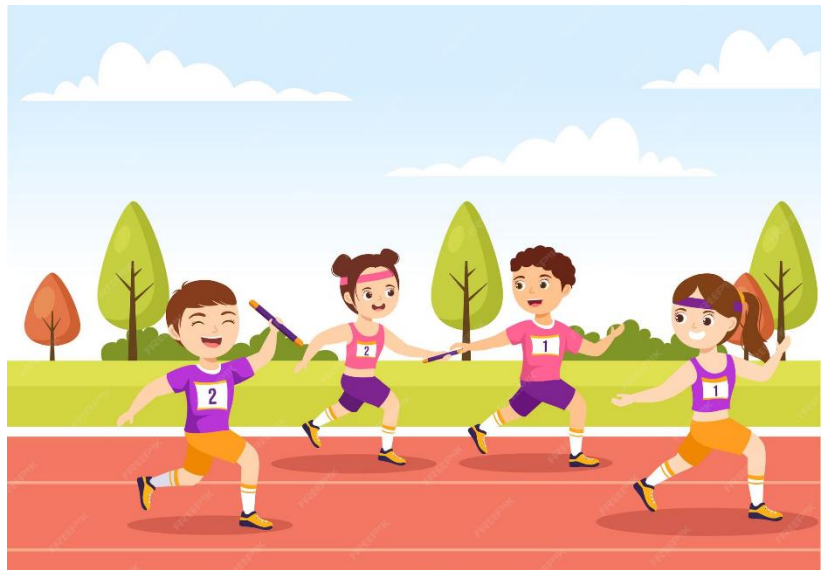

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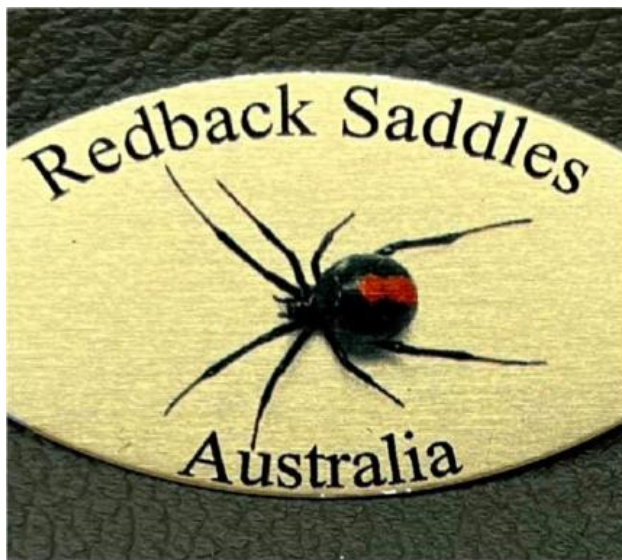

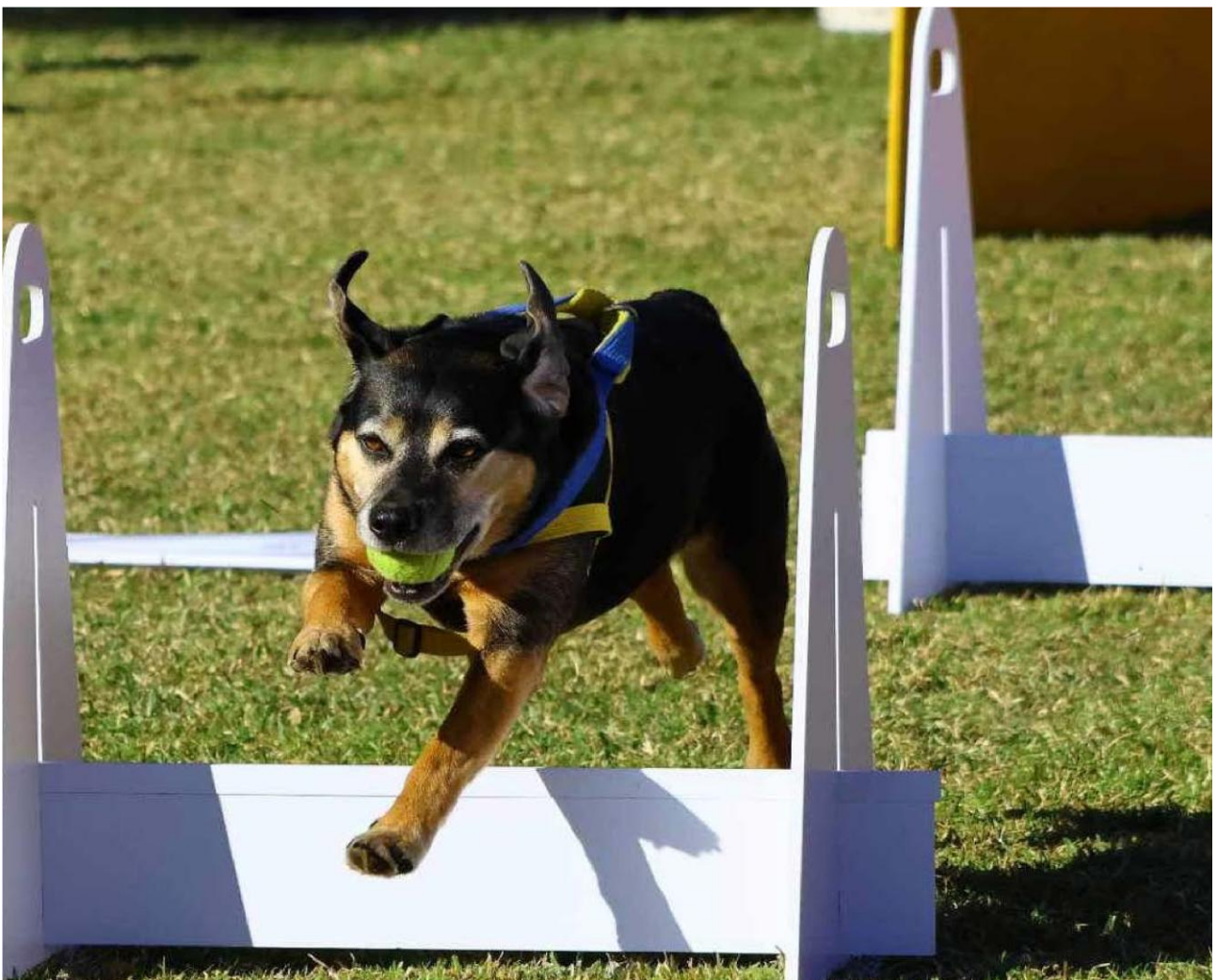

### **Conditions:**

- DPI Record of Attendance form and Waivers to be signed, and are available at the back of this program, by contacting the Horse section via email on [crookwellhorsesection@gmail.com](mailto:crookwellhorsesection@gmail.com) , or in person at the Horse Office on the day of the show.
- Entries can be made online via Nominate [www.nominate.com.au](http://www.nominate.com.au) with the online closing date 03/02/2026
- Entries on the day will be accepted with a \$10 registration fee per horse/competitor.
- Entry Fees are \$6 per class . All entry fees must be paid before competing.
- Entry on the day tickets, must be handed to the ring steward before being judged in any event.

### **DRUG TESTING OF EXHIBITS**

Random Drug testing of horses may be carried out at this show, and in accordance with EA and RAS regulations. If any substance is found through the result of swabbing, then all procedures in accordance with RAS rules and regulations will be followed.

### **PROPERTY IDENTIFICATION CODES (PIC)**

As from the 1st of September 2012, people with horses on their property need to apply for a PIC.

This is a biosecurity measure, and compulsory.

PICS are assigned to individual properties and are allocated by Livestock Health & Pest Authorities, who also maintain the register. You may already have a PIC if you pay rates to the LHPA. Forms can be obtained online through the website [www.lhpa.org.au](http://www.lhpa.org.au)

Every exhibitor bringing horses onto the show grounds will be required to complete the declaration, listing each horse, with the PIC for the property of origin prior to competing.

### **Horse Exhibitions Rules & Regulations**

The Crookwell Agricultural show will be run in accordance with the Royal Agricultural Society of NSW rules and by laws.

1. Awards will be made public, as judged.

2. **Age of Horses/Ponies:** To be calculated from 1 August. Every Horse or Pony foaled before August 1 in any year, shall be deemed to be year old on that date.
3. **Behaviour of Competitors & Exhibits:** If the Ringmaster in his/her opinion finds the behaviour of any exhibitor, to be disruptive or offensive in any way, the ringmaster holds the right of refusal of entry and expulsion from grounds, and competition to those offending competitors/persons.
4. **Breed Classes:** All exhibits must be registered with the relevant society for the breed class in which they are entered. Owners of these exhibits must also be current financial members of the breed society/association in which they are exhibiting in a registered breed class.
5. **Broodmare:** is a mare/filly which has a foal at foot, or has a current service certificate, and is verified in foal. Broodmares are not eligible to exhibit in any other class. Wet mares must be accompanied by their foals.
6. **Stallions or Colts:** May only compete in classes specified, and must be led by a competent person 18 years or older. A colt/stallion over the age of 1 year, must have a bit in mouth.
7. **Novice:** A Novice is a horse/pony that has not won, or placed first in any Novice, Intermediate, or Open saddle class at any agricultural show.
8. **Intermediate:** Never awarded Champion or Reserve at any Agricultural show.
9. **Rider Classes:** Riders age will be determined as the age on the first day of the show. Proof of Age must be shown if requested by the show officials.
10. **Beginner Ring/Classes:** Beginner Ring and classes are for competitors not capable of competing in the open rings. Horses/Ponies, and competitors in the beginner rings/classes cannot compete in open ridden classes. Exception given only to the led sporting events. Beginner riders are encouraged and eligible to compete in the led sporting events, as are the horse/pony.
11. **Local Events:** Local Events are restricted to those who live and reside in the Upper Lachlan Shire Council or Goulburn Council Municipality. Residents and exhibits must have resided within the local council municipality for a minimum 3 months prior to the show.
12. **Judges Decision:** Once a class has been judged, it shall not be rejudged. The Judge's decision shall be considered final. No Exhibitor, their family or associates shall approach a judge with regard to a decision, unless they have first obtained permission from a show official or ring steward, who may make an appointment with the Judge at an appropriate and proper time and place. If the Judge agrees to such meeting, a show official/member of the society shall be in attendance. The Judge has all rights to refuse any requests.
13. **Protests:** All protests must be made in writing and lodged with the secretary within 24 hours of the show. The secretary can be contacted through the Crookwell Show Society website, [www.crookwellshow.com](http://www.crookwellshow.com). All protests must be accompanied by a \$50 deposit.

The deposit will be forfeited if the majority of the Crookwell Show committee deem the protest frivolous and without merit.

14. **Pleasure Harness:** A Pleasure Harness Horse is one which can be safely taken out on a club type drive and give the driver a relaxed stress free experience. It should show an ability to drive on a soft rein, does not pull, moves forward and freely and does not require excessive driving. The horse/pony should have a strong trot and free and willing walk. The horse/pony should be patient and content to stand for a period of time, is obedient and can turn willingly on both reins and is not inclined to shy.

The Pleasure Harness Horse/Pony workout should include the following:

Walk. Halt for at least 10 seconds at a designated spot. Trot through a serpentine of cones. Trot to the left and right. A controlled rein back, and "shafting" to the left and right, simulation of going through a gate-stop and wait for the gate to be opened by the steward, walk through, stop whilst the gate is closed and then move on at a walk, walk or trot past on object on the ground (eg jacket). The horse/pony will be judged whilst waiting also, on their ability and willingness to stand quietly and patiently.

**Pleasure Turnout:** The Pleasure Turnout will be judged as above, but with the addition of consideration to the vehicle, complete with accessories such as: Picnic Lunch, Head Collar and Lead, Bucket and Feed for the horse, strong safe harness, quick release clips preferable. Driver and Passenger attire should be neat, clean and well maintained.

The Society will not be held responsible for any accident/injury that may be caused through/by any exhibitor/exhibit. It is a condition of entry that such an exhibitor shall hold the society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceeding arising from such an accident. The society will not under any circumstances be responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of livestock or other exhibits of any kind, or injury done thereto.

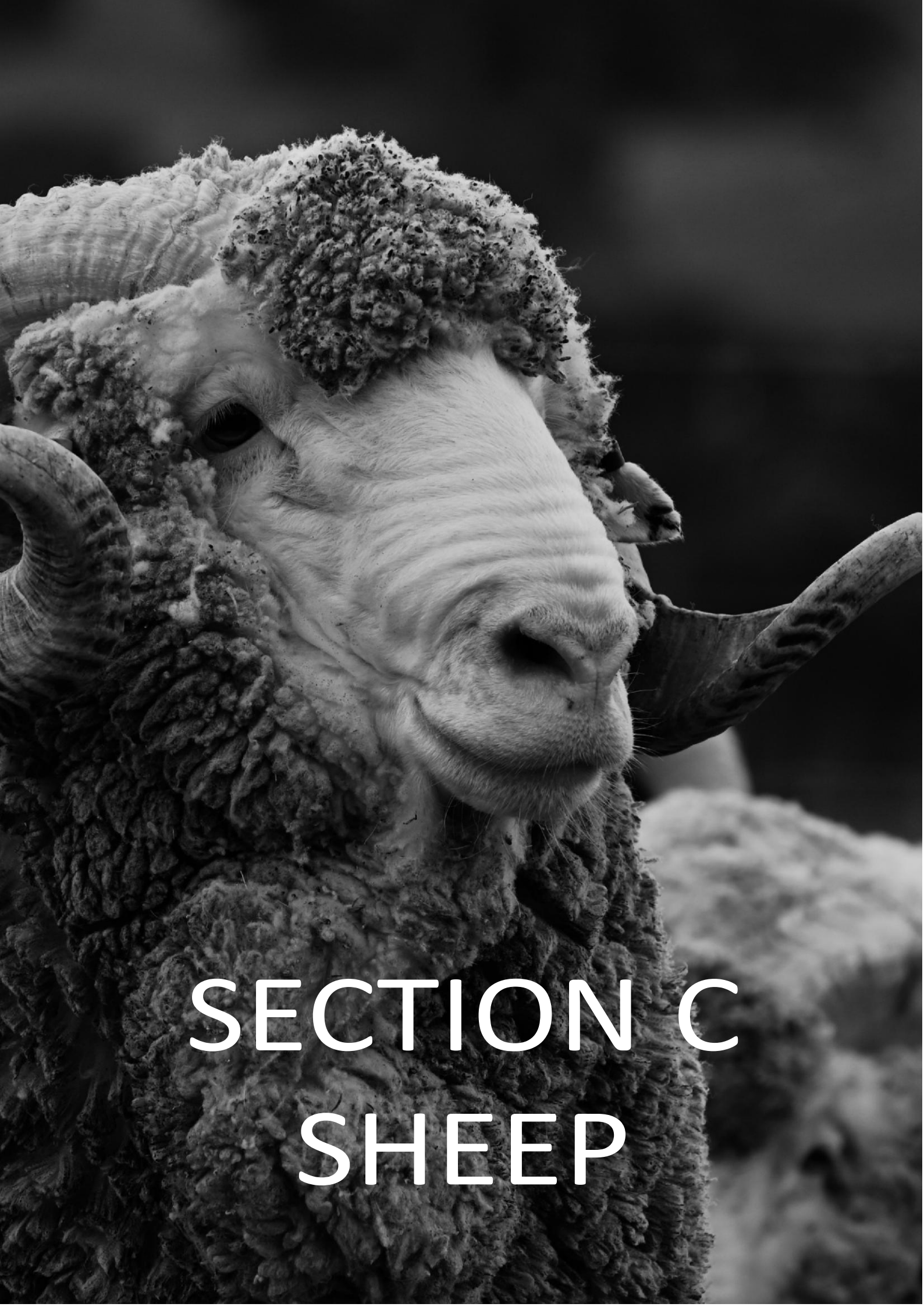

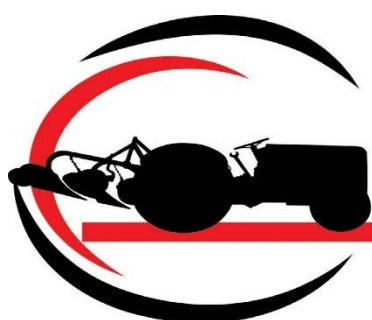

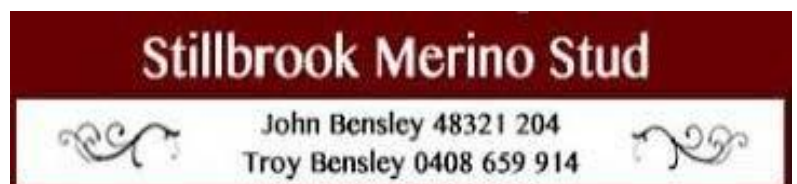

## CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. The competition is open to any person, partnership or company; provided the sheep exhibited have been bred on the property of that person, partnership or company and the property is in the Crookwell region. For boundary clarification please contact the Chief Steward.
2. The sheep exhibited must have been running on the property of the entrant for the full twelve months and must carry the registered earmark of the entrant.
3. Sheep entered in the competition must not carry more than twelve months wool. Rugging and/or pampering of sheep included in the entry is not allowed. If, in the opinion of the judges and/or committee other non-commercial practices have been carried out, they may disqualify that entrant from participation in that year's competition. The judge and/or committee's decision will be final.
4. To compete, all "classed in" maiden merino ewes of the same drop and showing the applicable NLIS coloured tag for the respective year must be available for judging. A minimum of 50 ewes are required to compete.
5. Teams will be judged on the following scale:

<b>Wool quantity for type</b>	<b>50 points</b>
<b>Wool quality &amp; character for type</b>	<b>50 points</b>
<b>Conformation, Structure, Size for type</b>	<b>50 points</b>

6. Each exhibitor must complete an entry form. A fee of \$60.00 will be charged to assist in covering costs and memberships. Payment must accompany the entry form.
7. On the day of judging all maiden ewes must be presented as one mob in a yard for judging with access to a drenching race. The judges will instruct when to fill the race for further inspection.
8. In addition, entrants will be required to display their top five ewes in a separate pen on judging day. This gives each entrant an opportunity to present the direction of their breeding operation and to give the judges an idea of where the breeder wants to be in their enterprise in the future.

9. Exhibitors shearing after 1st December 2025 are entitled to present 10% (to a max of 50 head) of their maiden ewes in full wool for judging. Apart from the exhibitors top five these should be a random selection.

10. Eight finalists will be announced in no particular order at the presentation evening. Four finalists will be from entries shorn before 1st September 2025 and four finalists from entries shorn between 1st September 2025 and 28th January 2026. First to Fourth placings will be awarded in each category at the Crookwell Show with the highest scoring flock being awarded the Champion Prize.

11. All entrants (or a representative) are required to attend the presentation evening at the Crookwell Services Club on Thursday 29th January 2026.

12. Five ewes from each of the eight finalists must be displayed at the Crookwell Show, where the placings will be announced on Sunday 8th February 2026 at 1.00pm. Display is from 9.30am to 3.30pm. A National Vendor Declaration and National Sheep Health Statement must be provided prior to displaying ewes at the show.

13. Any person, partnership or company, who is a registered stud of the N.S.W Stud Merino Breeders Association or who has bred and then sold or traded merino rams to another merino enterprise within the last five years, will be ineligible to enter the competition.

14. If joining is in progress the exhibitor may leave the rams in if they desire.

15. Exhibitors will be required to provide some basic information, as per Entry Form details, regarding the sheep and property operation on the day of inspection.

16. Standard culling percentage of approximately 30% is deemed acceptable in the commercial sheep industry. Extremes above or below may incur penalties where the judges see fit

#### **Ingredients:**

- 250 g (8 oz) sultanas
- 250 g (8 oz) chopped raisins
- 250 g (8 oz) currants
- 125 g (4 oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90 g (3 oz) chopped red glace cherries 90 g (3 oz) chopped blanched almonds 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250 g (8 oz) plain flour
- 60 g (2 oz) self-raising flour 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250 g (8 oz) butter
- 250 g (8 oz) soft brown sugar



1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

1/2 teaspoon almond essence 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence 4 large eggs

**Instructions:**

- Mix together all the fruits and nuts
- Sprinkle with the sherry or brandy
- Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight
- Sift together the flours and spices
- Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences
- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition
- Alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures
- Mix thoroughly; the mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon
- Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20 cm (8")
- Bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 1/2 - 4 hours
- Allow the cake to cool in the tin

**Note:** - To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 - 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 - 4 pieces

## State Competition

ASC Group 7 Regional Finals

5<sup>th</sup> December 2026.

Three different types of wool articles and/or garments

### Conditions:

- 1 For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:  
Garment: an item that can be worn eg dress, jacket, scarf, hat  
Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home eg blanket; with an outfit eg bag; for amusement eg toy; and (iv) as a decoration eg picture etc.
- 2 The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of 80% wool.
- 3 Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of sewing machine is permitted).
- 4 A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available as with hand spun/felted a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- 5 An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- 6 All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months 7 prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7 An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article /garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.

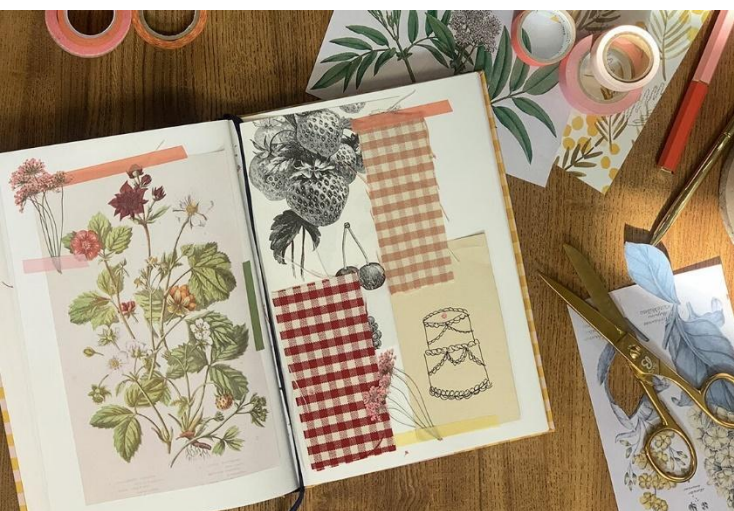

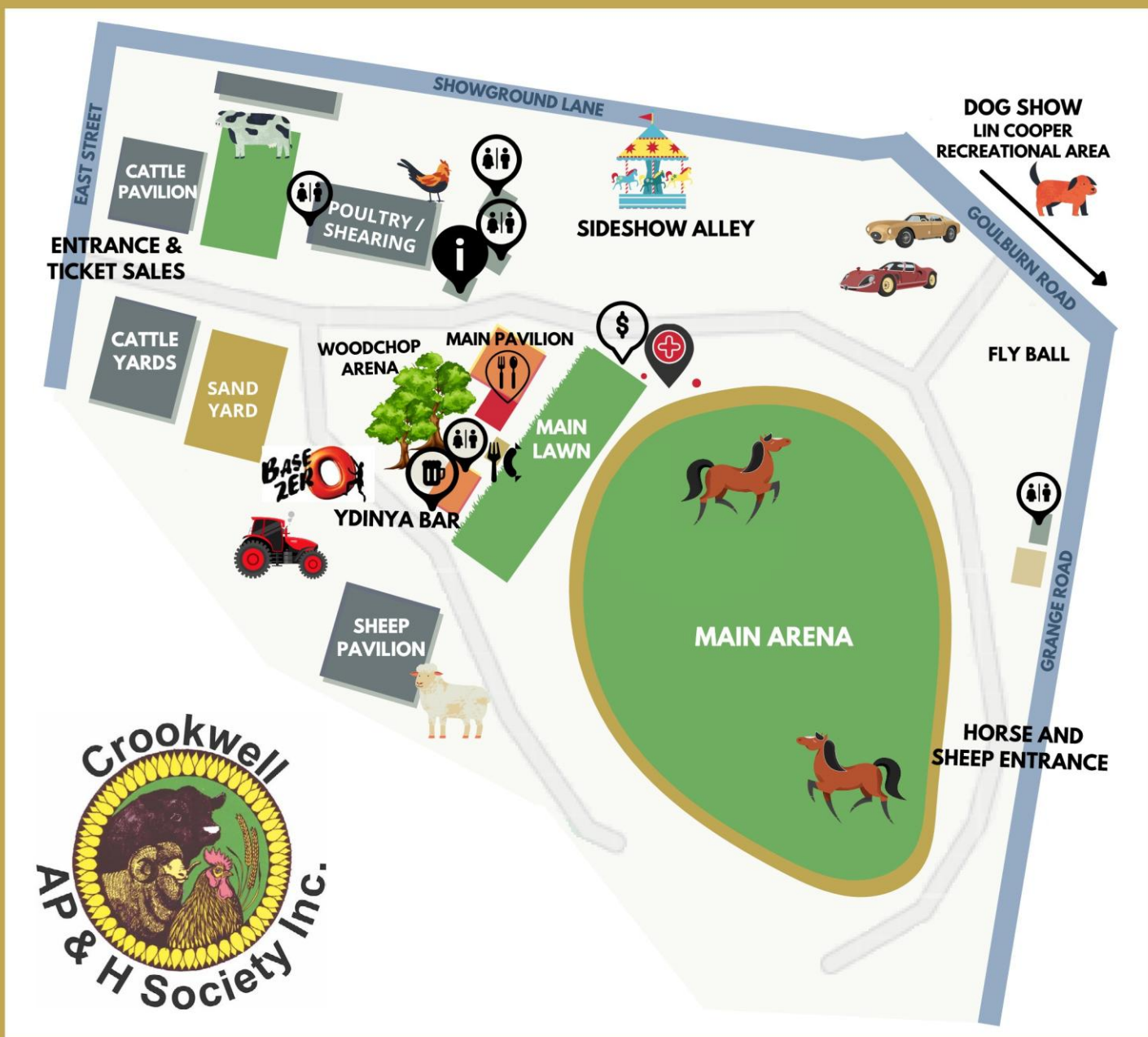
